#### **POLICING IN ESSEX**

Ms. Jane Gardner, the Deputy PCC, gave an interesting insight into the strategic priorities of the Police Service in Essex and the challenges faced in trying to implement the necessary actions. She highlighted the actions being taken to improve front line response and to increase police presence to the public.

Questions from the public included the lack of feedback on crime investigations, speeding, cyclists, poor reporting to Neighbourhood Watch coordinators and the lack of a local police presence.

#### **COMMUNITY AWARDS**

The Chairman announced that the Council wished to recognise residents who had made significant contributions to the village community. Awards were presented to Keith Ferguson for his contribution to planning matters in the village, the emergency plan, the Living Landscapes project and his many years as a councillor and to Lynda Ferguson for her work on Open Gardens and St Mary's Church.

## **QUALITY COUNCIL**

Mr. John Gili-Ross presented the Quality Council Foundation Award to the Chairman and congratulated the Council on achieving this award.

## **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

The Chairman was pleased to report that a team has been established to work on a Neighbourhood Plan for the village and encouraged more residents to come forward and assist the group.

The Rapid Response Team were thanked for their support for the village litter pick the previous weekend and for providing refreshments for all involved.

He thanked the Councillors, Clerk and the Hall Caretaker for their support and hard work over the past 12 months.

## **PUBLIC QUESTION TIME**

The planned consultation on the future of Bradwell Power Station was brought to the Council's attention and was encouraged to develop a position and participate in the consultation.

The Council was requested to consider a more welcoming message at the village signs when they are to be replaced.

In response to a question about the new poles being installed at Spring Close and Hammonds Road, the Chairman advised that these were for automated flood warning signs which had been requested by the Fire Service to avoid call outs to stranded motorists.

There were complaints about the poor mobile signals and broadband speeds in the village.

There were concerns about getting appointments at the new medical centre as waiting times are much longer now the new centre is open.

Councillor Richmond thanked the Butler Trust for grants his daughter had received.

City Councillor Ian Wright stated the importance of a Neighbourhood Plan in terms of influencing the evolution of the village and encouraged residents to support the team in the development of a Neighbourhood Plan.

The Chairman thanked Ms. Gardner and Mr. Gili-Ross for their contribution to the meeting. He also thanked the members of the clubs and societies that had supported the Exhibition and the Little Baddow WI for providing the refreshments.
